# Chief Administrative Officer's Report By CAO Stéphane Cyr June 16, 2021

### **PROJECT FILES:**

#### **Internet:**

- All services are now available.
- Mainland is starting to reach out to its initial customers who were installed when only the 300mbps service was available, to offer phone, TV, and upgrades to 1Gbps.
- Roughly 210 customers added so far.
- Crews are still progressing on the phases mentioned in last month's CAO Report.
- Make ready work is currently being done for Victor Lake, Thibault Rd, and Charles Lake
- Installations are now being completed in Phases 1 to 6, specifically:
  - o Route 1 from Comeauville to St. Bernard
  - o New Edinburgh / Bas-de-la Rivière
  - o Ohio to Hassett
  - o Side roads along Phase 1
  - o Concession, Patrice Rd, Little Brook Station
  - o Concession, St. Joseph, PF Comeau Rd
- Installations were delayed due to splicing and cables that were back ordered. That said, installations in Phase 7 (Cultural Hub to Amirault Road / Saulnierville Road, Second Division Road, Eustache Comeau Road) should start in a couple weeks.
- Installations in Phases 8-10 (Saulnierville, Saulnierville Rd., C. Saulnier Rd., Meteghan River, d'Entremont Rd., Placide Comeau Rd., Meteghan Connector, Bonnie Rd., Peter Dugas Rd, John Thibodeau Rd.) will follow shortly thereafter.
- The Warden, CAO, and staff met with Mainland on June 7, 2021, to discuss communication strategies as well as promotional and community engagement opportunities.

#### **Clare Veterans Centre (CVC)**

- No substantial change from May 19, 2021, CAO Report
- Funding application to the newly launched Green and Inclusive Community Buildings program (GICB) was submitted on May 4, 2021.
- Applicants with small and medium green and accessible retrofit projects to existing community buildings ranging in total eligible cost from \$100,000 to \$3 million are accepted on a continuous basis and funded on a first-come, firstserved basis.
- The total cost for the proposed CVC project is \$1,990,529 \$2,330,280, depending on contingencies. Municipal contribution has been set at \$537,443.

### Breakwater - Belliveau Cove

- Needed repairs to the lighthouse have commenced.
- Currently waiting on NSPI for go ahead to restore power to the lighthouse.
- Final insurance payout in the amount of \$10,283 has been agreed to, in order to complete this work and replace four benches lost during last winter's storm.
- The claim will be closed once payment is received.

### **Tourism Public Spaces**

- EDI (ACOA) funding application in the amount of \$164,867 has been submitted.
- Funding application to the NS Beautification and Streetscaping Program in the amount of \$25,000 (maximum allowable) has been submitted.
- Municipality has already confirmed it contribution of \$50,000.
- Total project costs, when factoring in federal and provincial funding, is potentially \$239,867.
- Still waiting for confirmation of an in-person meeting with NS Department of Lands & Forests (Maurice Comeau, District Manager and Clinton Pinks, Parks Planner) for site visits and to request in-kind planning/surveying support for detailed design at both Smugglers Cove and Mavillette Beach.

## **Housing Action Plan:**

- With the housing action plan complete, the Municipality is now focused on implementation. The following three recommendations have been flagged for implementation:
  - Villa Acadienne Assessment of development potential including sight specific concept plans, costing estimates, pro-forma statements, etc. which may facilitate any future efforts by the Board to divest itself of this property.
  - REOI/RFP to Secure Land within the Municipality for Affordable Housing Development
  - o REOI/RFP to Secure Developer for School Sites
- The Board of the Villa Acadienne has confirmed its willingness to participate in this initiative
- A new letter of engagement has been signed with SHS Consultants, including the aboved-noted recommendations.

## **Asset Management:**

- Application to FCM Municipal Asset Management Program has been approved.
- Building on the Municipality's participation in the Asset Management Cohort,
  AIM Network has been selected as the lead consultant in the preparation of the Municipality's Asset Management Plan.
- A quick off meeting with Matt Delorme, Project Manager for AIM Network, will be scheduled for next week.

## **Fast EV Chargers**

- No substantial change from May 19, 2021 CAO Report
- Advised by the WREN on May 11, 2021 that their application (of which we are a part) to NRCan was not successful.
- Apparently, the application scored well but given strong interest in the program and the number of applications received, it was not selected for funding as part of this intake.
- NRCan has provided the WREN with some feedback on where they could improve their application. It is the intention of the WREN to reapply.
- There are now two streams to apply to, one of which has recently opened, with the other stream opening in two months.
- As a reminder, this project application, if successful, would yield 3 Level-3 EV
  Chargers (i.e., Fast EV Chargers) in the Municipality at the following locations:
  - o Joseph and Marie Dugas Park
  - o Clare Veterans Centre
  - o Cape. St. Mary Lighthouse Park

### **Meteghan Sidewalks:**

- No substantial change from May 19, 2021 Council meeting.
- Added to the agenda for discussion at the July 7, 2021 Council-in-Committee meeting.

#### **Clare Health Centre:**

- Generator and fuel tank are in place.
- Vents and louvers are installed.
- Waiting on installation of bus bar in panel. This will be done in the coming weeks, over the weekend, so as to minimize disruption to the Centre's operations.

### Track and Field:

- Motion to approve project management services to be discussed under New Business – Item 12.1
- RFP for construction of the proposed facility has been posted on the NS procurement website and the Municipality's website, with a closing date of June 25, 2021.

# **FINANCIAL:**

- As of May 31, 2021, the Municipality has recorded \$7,983,505 in revenues versus \$1,896,490 in expenses, for a surplus of \$6,087,015.
- As of May 31, 2021, the Municipality has a balance of \$1,366,964 in its operating fund, \$147,706 in its capital fund and a total reserve balance of \$5,719,610. The total reserve balance can be broken down as follows:
  - o Operating reserve \$2,179,054
  - o Capital reserve \$2,711,457
  - o Landfill closure reserve \$334,257
  - o Gas tax reserve \$494,842
